Provision of environmental enrichment is aimed at enhancing animal well-being by giving animals opportunities to express species-typical behavior. Selection of methods and items for environmental enrichment for nonhuman primates commonly used in research should be based on an understanding of their normal behavior. This presentation will focus on typical behaviors of macaques (*Macaca spp.*) and marmosets (*Callithrix jacchus*) and provide examples of environmental enrichment that appear to have a positive impact on these species. Various negative examples will also be shared.
