


Formal and informal evaluation of classroom, safety checks, staff training, student class assignments, holds meetings with teachers monthly.

Overview of Class



Infants will join the class from April 1 and will remain in this class until end of March 2025.

- The legal ratio in Japan for children aged 2-11 months is 1:3 and for children aged 1-2 is 1:6.
- At present, Akasan classroom has 5 teachers and Kukuru classroom has 4 teachers.

- Class Dojo and email









Outcomes

- Use baby sign language to express their feelings










Baby Sign Language



Baby sign language basics offer multiple benefits for children:

- Reducing frustration
- Facilitating language development
- Encouraging gesturing, pointing

The Infants class teachers are using some baby sign language everyday. If you are interested in using baby sign language with your child please let us know and we can share a basic guide sheet that you can use to work together with your baby at home.

In the beginning, we will be flexible to accommodate the needs of the children.
Gradually children will be able to follow this schedule.

For babies, physical and emotional development is very important. They are completely dependent on their caregivers and need plenty of adult attention.
Providing them food, a place to sleep and play, or changing diapers are needed to form firm attachment with teachers.

Drop Off of Infant Class







- First, please sign in by the iPhone.
- Please hand over children's belongings, such as bottles and diapers to the teacher.
- Children's belongings are stored on their own shelves by the teacher.
- Please tell the teacher how the children are doing at home and their feeding schedule.

About Milk

• Please bring four or five bottles of prepared milk to the class every day.



• Please bring an extra bottle for your child.

•The milk brought from home will be stored in the class fridge.

• During the day, the milk will be warmed and fed by the teachers according to the child's schedule.



About Milk

All bottles must be labeled with the child's name, the date the formula is made and type of milk.
 Please bring plastic feeding bottles (Glass bottles require a silicon cover for safety hazard.)





Breast Milk

If your child is breastfed, We can give breast milk by bottle, or we can call mother to arrange feeding times.

-Please use breast milk storage bags when you bring breast milk.

-Breast milk is received by hand from the parent/guardian

-When receiving breast milk we confirm the name, date of expressed and number (volume).

-Breast milk received at the CDC must have been expressed within the past six months.

About Snacks and School Lunch

- As children become 6 month of age, it's time to start to introduce solid foods. Please do not send babies with foods that have not been first introduced at home.
- We will start feeding him or her once a day at lunchtime, then gradually feed them twice a day.
- Parents can provide home lunch or order school lunch(however, we recommend baby to start school lunch after they turned 1 year old because of salt content) Our school lunch is provided by a vendor that supplies food to hospitals, elderly care facilities and preschools, and they have different consistencies to match the needs of our babies.
- Please note that the salt content in the school lunch is about 1.5 grams per serving. The daily recommended amount of salt for a baby aged 1-2 is 3 grams. Nutrition guidelines differ between countries and we recommend you reduce salt intake at other meals if you order school lunch.
- About snack, Although it says snack time, you can bring a normal meal.

About Snacks and School Lunch Parents can provide home lunch or order school lunch.


Kizami (Consistency of Food)

Pick Up and Drop Off Routine

Morning Drop Off

- Please drop your child off from 8:00 9:30 a.m.
- If your child is sick or cannot attend for some reason, please call, or e-mail (<u>akasan@oist.jp</u> kukuru@oist.jp)
- before 9:00 am that day to let us know.
- Please sign in by the iPhone each day.

Afternoon Pick Up

- Please sign out by the iPhone each day.
- Children will not be released to any other person who is not designated for Alternative Pick-Up Authorization.
- Bottles, cup, containers for lunch and snack, and dirty clothes should be taken home each day. Diapers are kept in CDC.
- Please take home your child's bed sheet and blanket on the last day of the week.
- We open from 8:00 a.m.- 6:00 p.m., Monday to Friday. A late fee of ¥1,000 will be charged for every 15 minutes after 6:00 p.m
- Children are not allowed to play on the playground after pick-up.




