
Point of contact for concerns after speaking with the class teacher.

School Year 2024: April 1, 2024 - March 31, 2025.


Ratio = 1 teacher to 6 children

About 2 Years-old

"Independence A.K.A. Stubbornly Assertive" Three Major Characteristics of 2-year-olds

1. Stubbornness & Fussiness

A child who used to walk around being held by the hand, but when you try to do something for the child, the child says, "No, I do it!" and becomes rebellious. So-called "parent-child conflict" may begin. You may find it difficult to handle them because they take pride in themselves, and you may also find yourself saying, "Do as I say!" or "No, you can't do that!". However, it is important to create an environment where they can assert themselves in a secure manner without saying things like, "You can't do that!" and stifling their budding ego.

2. Possessiveness

This is a strong desire to own the things they like, which leads to more fights and fighting over things.

3. Actions before Words

Because they cannot yet express their needs in words well, they push without asking to move, or take without asking to borrow. Therefore, it is important to try to understand the meaning of their actions and we continue to teach toddlers how to express themselves in appropriate ways.



Self-care Skills

Self-care Skills refer to tasks necessary to participate in daily life such as dressing and undressing, eating, washing hands and dry with paper towels, and so on. While adults typically provide support in early childhood, it is expected that they will become more independent as they grow older.

- Organization Skills

involves the ability to establish what tasks that they need to do, by when and how. Part of organization involves understanding the requirements of a task. Organization is an important skill required to follow daily routines and complete self-care activities.



The major self-care skill to be learned is -Toilet Training

Parents and teachers should discuss and agree on the planned toilet training process. It requires a team effort!

A consistent approach and common encouragement techniques can minimize confusion of a child during this time and help to set the environment for a successful transition to becoming a big child!

Children are able to control their bladder and bowels when they're physically ready and when they want to be dry and clean. Each child is different, so please discuss with teachers.





Expected Outcomes

Social-Emotional Development

- feeling more secure at school
- participating in routine activities easily
- begin to understand and respect the rights of others
- moving from parallel play to more interactive play with peers
- demonstrate increasing independence such as making choices, putting on jacket, toileting, handwashing
- begin to take responsibility for maintaining the classroom environment
- express thoughts and feelings in appropriate way

Cognitive Development and Language Development

- enhance their listening and speaking skills,
- express their thoughts and feelings in simple words including communicating and sharing ideas with teachers and peers
- memorize and connect with experiences
- demonstrate a positive attitude toward learning: ask and use solutions, explore ways to make things happen
- understanding and following directions
- ask and respond to questions
- Recognize his or her own first names



Expected Outcomes

Mathematical Skills & Scientific Thinking

- sense and recognize numbers
- counting
- learning Shapes and patterns
- observe and ask questions (I wonder...?)
- demonstrate knowledge of the living things (Classify living and non-living things)
- describing and predicting
- understand simple cause and effect
- planning and recording investigations

Physical Development

- run, catch, throw, kick, go up and down stairs
- improve manipulation of small objects
- improve hand-eye coordination through play using a variety of materials: play dough, puzzles, finger plays, art project, songs and more.

Strategies Toddler Class Teachers use:

- Positive Guidance
- Redirection/ Distraction
- Modeling
- Talk about Causes and effects
- Help children express their emotions in appropriate ways

Morning Drop Off


- Sign in on a class iPhone

Educational purpose: Practice "eating without soiling clothes"




